#### **Magna Carta book shortlisted in Longman History Today Awards**

*Magna Carta: The Foundation of Freedom 1215–2015* has been recognised in the prestigious Longman History Today Awards, finishing runner up in the category Best Historical Picture Researcher of the Year 2015. Addressing a distinguished audience of publishers and academics at the awards ceremony held last night at the Old Hall, Lincoln's Inn, editor of *History Today* Paul Lay paid tribute to the work of Third Millennium's picture researcher Patrick Taylor. The book was one of three shortlisted titles in what Lay described as an exceptionally strong field of nominations. Third Millennium's Publishing Director Neil Titman commented, 'We are very proud of what Patrick has achieved – his work has demonstrated that even as a small independent company we can compete with the biggest and most established names in history publishing.'

### **American Bar Association launch**

Friday 8 August 2014 saw the formal launch of the various subscriber editions of *Magna Carta: The Foundation of Freedom 1215–2015*, with Neil Titman and Marketing Manager Sarah Yeatman in attendance at the American Bar Association's annual meeting in Boston. Much activity and interest was generated around Third Millennium's book stand – in particular, Professor Dan Magraw of Johns Hopkins University, author of *Magna Carta and the Rule of Law*, and Jack Rives, Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer of the American Bar Association, both praised the book's erudition and elegance.

Next month will see the formal launch of the general edition of the book – more details to follow.

### **Magna Carta book on tour**

Magna Carta will be a prominent feature on the literary festival circuit this year, and Third Millennium is delighted to announce the appearance of four of the contributing authors at events across the country:

Professor Nicholas Vincent, the book's principal author and general editor, will appear at a Magna Carta event at the Oxford Literary Festival on 26 March 2015.

Professor Anthony Musson, author of the chapter on Magna Carta in the Later Middle Ages, will appear on a Magna Carta panel at Chipping Campden Literary Festival on 9 May 2015.

Justice Richard Goldstone, author of the chapter on Magna Carta in the 21st century, will appear on two Magna Carta panels at Hay on Wye Literary Festival on 23 and 24 May 2015.

Professor Miles Taylor, author of the chapter on Magna Carta in the 19th century, will appear at a Magna Carta event at Broughton Castle, Banbury on 25 June 2015.

Meanwhile across the Atlantic, Professor Joyce Malcolm, author of the chapter on

Magna Carta in the United States, will be speaking at the Baronial Order of Magna Charta's Triennial Symposium, to be held at the Cosmos Club Ballroom, Washington, DC, on 16 April 2015.


